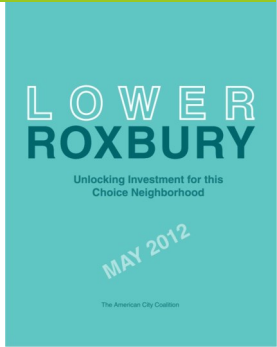
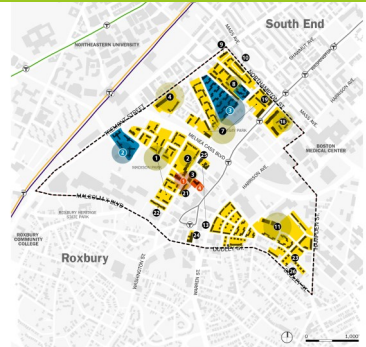
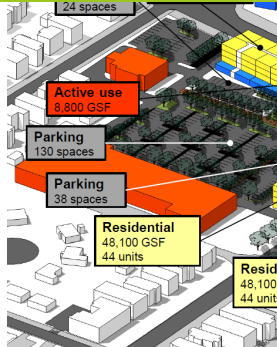
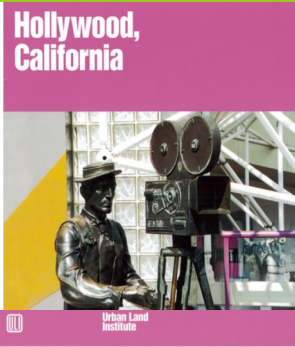


20 Years Supporting Sustainable Strategies for Neighborhood Revitalization Programs



1994-Joseph E. Corcoran founded TACC with the purpose to transform distressed neighborhoods.

2001-Los Angeles Study: TACC supported the Urban Land Institute, in partnership with the Hollywood Chamber of Commerce, to provide redevelopment advice for Hollywood, which had steadily declined since the 1970s.

2009-Neil McCullagh appointed Executive Director

2011-Summer Internship Program: Established to provide professional development opportunities to students from Boston College that are passionate about helping urban communities.

2012-Lower Roxbury Housing Study: Aims to provide quality housing and bring economic prosperity with workforce development and increase resident access to transportation.

2012-Build Olneyville: Engaged by the Providence Housing Authority, TACC developed a Transformation Plan that represents the stakeholders' collective vision for Olneyville.

2000-A Decent Place to Live: Chronicled the successful redevelopment of a distressed Columbia Point to Harbor Point.

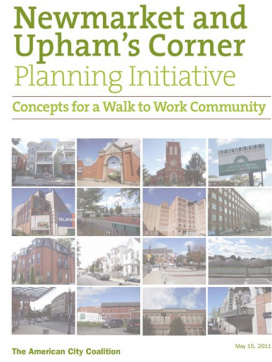
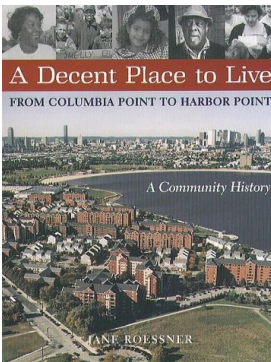
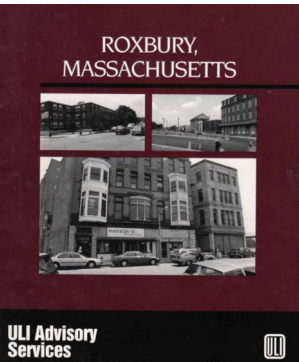
2010-Real Estate and Urban Action: TACC supported development and instruction of course at Boston College.
