PARTNERING WITH THE URBAN INSTITUTE

You may have seen the news that TACC is partnering with the Urban Institute on a six-month project to replicate the Urban Institute's HOST program in Pittsburgh. HOST is a dual generation program designed to help families break the cycle of poverty. Learn more [about the partnership](#).

STRENGTHENING BOSTON'S LOWER ROXBURY NEIGHBORHOOD

TACC has done considerable research on the condition of housing in Lower Roxbury; review the resources section of our website to access our study, [Lower Roxbury: Unlocking Investment for this Choice Neighborhood](#). In the last year, TACC has worked to support the [Boston Housing Authority](#) with the development of a Transformation Plan for Lower Roxbury that will replace obsolete public housing with high-quality, mixed-income housing and drive new investment. Additionally, TACC is working with the citizen-led Roxbury Strategic Master Plan Oversight Committee to provide ongoing technical support with the intent of accelerating the [development of underutilized public property](#).

CHANGING THE BUSINESS ENVIRONMENT TO CREATE INNER-CITY JOBS

TACC commissioned a study that promotes a plan to create four neighborhood revitalization districts along the Fairmount Indigo Line on the MBTA commuter rail. The study advances a business attraction and retention concept that forecasts the creation of 1,900 new jobs and 195 new or expanded businesses in Boston's neediest neighborhoods. MENTORING FOR GIRLS STRENGTHENS MIXED-INCOME COMMUNITIES

TACC identifies and builds partnerships that strengthen communities—household by household. TACC developed a partnership between the Harbor Point Community Task Force and Big Sister Association of Greater Boston that came together to launch a pilot program matching 25 girls to mentors. This community partnership brings together the needs of residents and property management with the expertise of Big Sister in a high-performing program getting [results](#).

BUILDING A PIPELINE OF COMMUNITY LEADERS

Last summer, TACC hosted six paid internships in community-based organizations across the city of Boston. This year, we are doubling the size of the internship program! We pair college students with Boston-based nonprofit organizations for 12-week internships that allow college students to contribute to local neighborhood revitalization efforts and to earn
